CNC engraving machines can be used for hollow carving and three-dimensional engraving of plate or three-dimensional parts.

"Tower is pleased to help fund the purchase of the Innovation Lab equipment at the Secondary School which will develop students' creative and problem-solving skills. This initiative aligns with Tower's mission to enrich the learning experiences of students and to help them develop essential lifelong skills," said Vicky Giouroukakis and Katie Derasse, Co-Presidents of the Tower Foundation of Manhasset in a joint statement.
